A Few Words from Fr Joe

Last Sunday at the 11.30am Mass in Kilmacud we said farewell to Sr Maureen, as she was recalled to her Order in Madrid. 10 years ago, she was assigned to the Clarissan Sisters apostolate in Dublin for a month or two, which became a decade of living here among us. During that time, in addition to her work in the Student Residence she felt called to get involved in the local parish community. She began by attending Mass here from time to time, then she volunteered as a Minister of the Word, and with her sonorous African voice brought God's word to life among us. She then progressed to the Parish Pastoral Council and shared her interest in every aspect of Church life with us there.

The farewell was well attended by a variety of African people living in Dublin, most notably their choir who sang during the liturgy. Some friends from the Nigerian Embassy attended in full celebratory dress and added to the colour and drama of the event. Four of the Sisters, including Sr Maureen herself, danced up the aisle with the offertory gifts. The Mass ended with joyful song and music and spilled over into the parish centre for refreshments. Then to conclude the gathering Fr Peter invited about 30 African friends to his home for a simple lunch in a spirit of gratitude for their contribution to the celebration and as a fitting way to socialise together before they headed home. I looked around at all of this energy, faith, enthusiasm radiating from the 'new Irish' and maybe for the very first time appreciated just how much the African community now contribute to our local church here in Ireland. For all the decades of my childhood and young adult life, first by collections in Lent for the 'black babies' and later Trocaire we sent support and aid out to Africa and the developing world. Now we live in a world of migration and integration and so many nationalities live among us and share their gifts with us.

It was my great joy during the week to hear many parishioners express their delight with the Mass and occasion and express appreciation for Sr Maureen and all the African community. With this spirit of inclusion and collaboration many good initiatives can take root among us.
