A few words from Fr Joe.....

When someone is elevated to high office, in any organisation, they might find that setting out in their new role involves carrying on some of the projects already started by their predecessor. Well this is certainly the case for Pope Leo XIV. He began his ministry as leader of our Church during the Jubilee of Hope which Pope Francis had already put in motion. He didn't get to choose the theme, work out the programme, plan the events, he just has to get on with what is in papal diary! So, this week it is the Jubilee of Youth.

Pope Leo, fresh from his 3-week break at Castel Gondolfo arrived back in Rome to find over 100,000 young people, from all across the world, waiting outside, and wondering if he might put in an appearance. On Tuesday evening, as they assembled in St Peters Square for the first huge prayer gathering, he looked out the window, watched them as they sang and shared the liturgy and made a spontaneous decision to go out and join the party. Just as the light was going out of the sky, and the event was drawing to a close, suddenly there he was, standing at the microphone, waving to them. They roared their welcome, cheered his presence and without a note, script or prepared text he spoke. He wanted to invite them to realise that they are followers of Christ, the salt of earth, the light of the world. His invitation in that moment was that they would all pray together for peace in the world, and pledge their lives to making that dream a reality. Then he blessed them, stepped into the Pope mobile and drove through the throngs of happy, joyful, spirit filled young people. It was mesmerising to see the effect his presence had, and to realise that we have a new man in the role, who has love in his heart, great affection for young people and the confidence to present Jesus to them as their Lord and Master. He looked and sounded so happy and that joy makes his ministry so infectious, I doubt that any of those young people will ever forget this encounter and many will have been transformed by it.


