A Few Words from Fr Joe.....

During the week we celebrated the Memorial of St John Vianney, who is the patron saint of priests. He lived in France, after the Revolution, in the town of Ars. He was a simple man, who had an exceptional gift for his ministry as a priest. Famous as a confessor, he certainly worked hard for the salvation of souls. He lived in the highly anti clerical French culture in the years after the Revolution. When he came to live in Ars the church had been taken over by the people and turned into a grain store. He set about reclaiming the sacred space and rebuilt the faith community against a lot of opposition. As he was successful, and Ars became a place of pilgrimage, many have forgotten the struggle and suffering involved in bringing a living faith back to the local community. As priests' we are invited to take inspiration from his spiritual journey, his resilience in face of opposition, his dedication to the sacraments and his personal austerity.

On the day we marked the memorial a parishioner read a prayer for priests in place of the Prayers of Intercession. This prayer was written about 30 years ago by Cardinal John O'Connor and it gives expression to one way that people might pray for the priests they know and care for. Some parishioners asked for the text of prayer and mentioned that they often pray for priests, something that we men in ministry really appreciate and depend on. Maybe this prayer will appeal to you too:

Lord Jesus, we your people pray to You for our priests. You have given them to us for OUR needs.

We pray for them in THEIR needs.

We know that You have made them priests in the likeness of your own priesthood. You have consecrated them, set them aside, anointed them, filled them with the Holy Spirit, appointed them to teach, to preach, to minister, to console, to forgive, and to feed us with Your Body and Blood.

Yet we know, too, that they are one with us and share our human weaknesses. We know too that they are tempted to sin and discouragement as are we, needing to be ministered to, as do we, to be consoled and forgiven, as do we. Indeed, we thank You for choosing them from among us, so that they understand us as we understand them, suffer with us and rejoice with us, worry with us and trust with us, share our beings, our lives, our faith.

We ask that You give them this day the gift You gave Your chosen ones on the way to Emmaus: Your presence in their hearts, Your holiness in their souls, Your joy in their spirits. And let them see You face to face in the breaking of the Eucharistic bread.

We pray to You, O Lord, through Mary the mother of all priests, for Your priests and for ours. Amen.
