

A Few Words from Fr Joe....

I stood at the altar for a moment at the beginning of a daily Mass during the week and felt a deep peace. The sun was shining in through the open doors, from outside came the happy sound of the children on a break, playing in the yard, in front of me faithful parishioners gathered to join hearts and minds in prayer. I had read the scriptures earlier and was moved by the call to have compassion and challenged by the radical Gospel preaching of Jesus, to love our enemies, to turn the other cheek. It was good for all of us to be present at this peaceful moment in the midst of our busy days and with all the pressures that the world around us brings to daily life.

Earlier that same morning the news was chilling, one commentator saying we've never been closer to war since the end of world war two as we are at this moment. A young American influencer had been shot in Utah and the news feed was grappling with the reality that people can become so radically opposed to others with a different view point than their own that they commit acts of violence. There was news of drone strikes in Ukraine and devastation in Gaza among many global conflicts. Listening to all that news left me feeling something between despair and anger.

The Gospel message and Christian discipleship are full of hope, with a message affirming God's love for our world, especially the poor and broken hearted, and an assurance that all will be well. We have a duty to ensure that this message is heard, to show by our lives that it converts and inspires and that ultimately peace will prevail. We must never lose hope.
